#### 4. First-aid measures

Inhalation

#### 6. Accidental release measures

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

# 7. Handling and storage

#### Precautions for safe handling

# Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Store locked up. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Prevent electrostatic charge build-up by using common bonding and grounding techniques. Eliminate sources of ignition. Avoid spark promoters. Ground/bond container and equipment. These alone may be insufficient to remove static electricity. Store in a cool, dry place out of direct sunlight.
